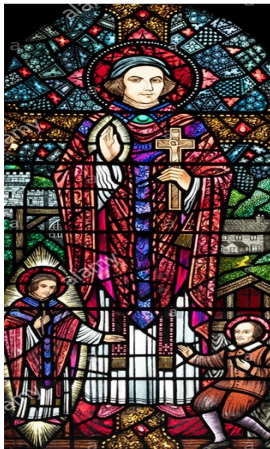

### Food for the journey

Sometimes it's good for us to be reminded of the underlying simplicity of living in the Kingdom! We can often lose sight of the truth, or find ourselves worrying about minor details of belief, that we can forget that before anything else we are called to love God and our neighbour. Jesus tells us today **"You must love the Lord your God, with all your heart...with all your soul and with all your mind, and you must love your neighbour as yourself"**. Love has so many facets and meanings to it – but one that is most important is to remember that love is an action. When we try to love Him with all our hearts, with all our souls and with all our minds, then the rest will follow naturally. We all know how hard it can be to really love those who treat us badly, but one way we can love them is to pray for them, as this can help them but is also very healing for us. When we look at the news and see images of what's happening in our world, we can feel overwhelmed and frightened and the future may seem bleak. It's important that we are aware of what's going on – we need to know so that we can pray for our world - but we need to keep balanced and take a closer look and say..... "Look what love is doing." ...it's caring for those in need.....seeing that the hungry are fed....the homeless sheltered.....the young are educated..... the elderly are cared for..... the bereaved are comforted... ..that's what love is doing! Love by its very nature must be shared with others – because love grows through love. This is the love that comes from God and unites us to Him. May our hearts be open even more to God's love, so that we grow in our capacity to love others as He does. Praise Him!

## FRIENDS OF THE HOLY LAND



The situation in the Holy Land remains very difficult with ongoing coronavirus infections resulting in intermittent lockdowns being reinstated. Israel has now declared a second national lockdown. Community transmissions are increasing rapidly in Gaza, where social distancing is physically not possible.

Many of the poorest Christians in the Holy Land will still not be able to work for many more weeks or months to come. Where they may have just been able to make ends meet, unemployment or reduced wages will push them over into debt. Basic needs like rent, food and medicines become heavy burdens they cannot afford.

Our office in the Holy Land is inundated by people seeking help and the reports from our partner organisations are the same.

Praying for our Christian family in the Holy Land is central to our work, in support to our Christian Brothers and Sisters in the West Bank, Gaza, Israel and Jordan, encouraging them and reminding them they are not forgotten.

*Almighty and ever loving Father, we pray for the Christians living in the Holy Land.*

*Lord, may the light of your love shine down on our Christian brothers and sisters in the Holy Land.*

*In your mercy grant them peace in their land, peace in their homes and peace in their hearts.*
