GOSPEL REFLECTION

According to this weekend's First Reading, wisdom is the most precious gift a person can have. It is a real treasure. Without it all other things can be useless because we won't know how to use them. On being told that he could have anything he wanted from God, Solomon asked for the gift of wisdom. God was pleased with his request and granted it to him.

There is a story of a teacher who wanted to make progress in his career and climb the social ladder. He worked very hard. In fact, his work WAS his life. He put his best hours and his best efforts into it. He had little time to appreciate his family, and even less for the enjoyment of life. It was clear to everyone where his real treasure was. But then he became very ill. He was taken to hospital where he lay for days, drifting in and out of consciousness, and not knowing whether he would live or die. There were moments when he noticed shadowy figures at his bedside. One day these figures came into focus and he immediately recognized them. They were his wife and children who visited him faithfully every day and spent hours at his bedside. In that moment he saw where his real treasure lay – it was his family, his home, in the gift of life itself, and, of course, in God. He saw how foolish he had been up to now. And he prayed with all his heart: "Lord, give me back my life and I'll be happy." And he resolved that, if he became well again, he would turn his priorities upside down.

All of us are searchers and treasure-hunters in the sense that we are looking for happiness. The goal is legitimate, but it may be that, like the teacher in the story, we are looking in the wrong place. Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be too." So, if we want to know what our treasure is, we need to ask ourselves where our heart is. What is it that we love? What is truly in our hearts? There may be many things, and many different people, but so long as God is there and the happiness of others, then we can't be going too far wrong. The wisdom of God, that Solomon received in the First Reading and alluded to in the Gospel parable, is not the same as worldly wisdom. It is something deeper and much more precious. It means knowing what is truly important in life. It means being able to see our lives from God's point of view, and being able to live the way God wants us to live.

Through the gift of wisdom God communicates to us the true meaning of life, and the richness of belonging to him. It is a gift which is worth more than any earthly treasure and, once we have received it, no one can take it from us.
