READINGS FOR THE WEEKEND.

First Reading - Prophet Isaiah 50:5-9.

For Isaiah the just person is sustained in all his trials by the firm belief that God is with them at all times.

Second Reading – Letter of St. James 2:14-18.

GOSPEL REFLECTION.

Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do the people say I am?" His disciples tell him that they think he is Elijah or John the Baptist. Then Jesus asks them, "Who do you say I am?" Silence is all around, until Peter dares to answer, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus congratulates Peter on his answer, at least until Jesus speaks of his inescapable fate of his suffering and death. Peter denies that this should happen, "This must nit happen to you." Then Peter is rewarded with Jesus' famous rebuke, "Get behind me, Satan!" Peter is clearly not thinking in the way that God wants him to think.

Is this just a story about Peter? Or is it a story for all of us? The answer should be obvious — it is for everyone. But how do we engage with the story today? The answer to that may not be as difficult as we think if we consider what Jesus actually said to Peter. Those words "Get behind me" are, in the original Greek of the Gospel, the same expression that Jesus used when he called his disciples to "follow me". To get behind Jesus is to follow him. That is the task of every disciple. Following Jesus was literally what his disciples did when they ere journeying, but the really sign of our following him today is to do his holy will.

UN Climate Change Conference.

The UK will host the 26th UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) in Glasgow from 31 October to 12 November 2021. 'COP' means 'conference of parties'. Leaders from 197 countries, including Pope Francis, who have signed up to the UN's climate change treaty, will travel to Glasgow to take part in the conference. This will be the largest gathering of world leaders ever to take place on British soil.

The focus of the conference will be how to keep temperature rises below 1.5C. If the world warms more than this threshold, millions more people in the most vulnerable communities around the globe will suffer from devastating droughts, storms, floods and other impacts of climate change. Governments will be obliged to set out more ambitious goals for ending their contribution to climate change under the Paris Agreement (2015).
