READINGS FOR THE WEEKEND.

First Reading - Book of Joshua 24:1-2.15-18.

Joshua confronts the people with a vital decision – to serve the one true God or to serve false gods.

Second Reading – St. Paul to the Ephesians 5:21-32.

St.Paul uses the image of a marriage relationship to express the bond that exists between Christ and his Church.

Gospel Reading – John 6:60-69.

The disciples of Jesus are faced with a vital decision, like the people in the Old Testament reading – to stay with him or to leave.

GOSPEL REFLECTION.

Today's First reading deals with a renewal ceremony concerning the Covenant God had made with his people. This took place in Shechem, shortly after the people had entered the promised land. Joshua calls upon them to make a choice. They must either serve the God of their fathers or to serve other gods. As the tribes of Israel declared, "We will serve the lord." It reminds us of the continuing call to repentance and commitment we must all make at some stage in our lives of faith. In a similar way, Jesus calls upon the people who listen to him speak about the "Bread of Life" to make up their minds whether or not they were going to believe in him and follow him. Sadly, many of them doubted his Word, despite witnessing all the healings and miracles he had done in their presence. Even amongst the Twelve a traitor lurked. Even though Jesus was sad to see those people leave him, he let them go. It wasn't necessarily great crowds he wanted to see, but people who were committed to him and to his Word.

As we continue our lives of faith may we always know what it means to follow Jesus. It is not the words we speak that matters but the commitment of our hearts and our very lives. As we are told to go forth to share he Word of God at the end of Mass, may we have the strength and grace to do just that, and allow the Jesus who is with us in each other and through the Eucharist, shine out upon those we meet each day.

COVID RESTRICTIONS.

Don't forget that, whilst many aspects are getting back to normal, we are not yet through the Pandemic and certain guidelines still have to be followed in Church....

Face coverings still remain mandatory for all those attending a church service.

Social distancing will not be mandatory but please respect the space of those around you.

Hand sanitising will remain necessary as people arrive AND leave.

Holy Communion is now in its tradition place during Mass but Communion under both kinds will not be re-introduced at this time.

Mass will end in the traditional way.

Singing can be restored.

Hymn books and service sheets can be used but only ONCE A DAY.

The collection basket should NOT be passed around – please leave your collection as you leave church.
