### **GOSPEL REFLECTION.**

Jesus gives us a lot to think about in today's Gospel. He speaks especially on behalf of married women and children. Both were vulnerable in the society that Jesus lived in and had little value or official protection. Women were too often seen as property, without social power to protect themselves. Jesus defends woman and speaks out for the protection of marriage. He seems to accept the reality of separation in some marriages. The passage is less about the rules and regulations for ordering relationships and more of a glimpse of God's loving plan. Jesus' words urge us to see the importance of marriage, rather than seeing commitment and love as fleeting. Then Jesus rebukes the disciples who try to block children from seeing him. "Let the little children come to me, for theirs' is the Kingdom of Heaven." While the disciples see the small children as being unimportant, with little economic or social power, Jesus wants to meet them for they are precious in his eyes. To emphasise this he says, "I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the Kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it."

The Gospel reminds us that we too must support those who are vulnerable, those who live on the threshold of society, those who may feel unimportant. It is to these people that Jesus wants to bless and come close to. May we, in our weakness, know the lovely strength of God's presence and share his good ness with others, especially in the way we treat those who are weak, poor and vulnerable. They may be weak in the eyes of the world, but they are loved by God.
