GOSPEL REFLECTION.

In today's Gospel we listen to the wonderful encounter between Jesus and one of his apostles, Thomas. Thomas doesn't want to believe until he has seen Jesus for himself. When he does he says those wonderful words, "My Lord and my God". It was through the gift of touch that Thomas came to believe that Jesus had truly risen from the dead. Until this moment he dared not to believe. It is Jesus himself who invites Thomas to touch his hands and his side.

We must love God and allow him to touch us if we wish our faith to increase. God touches us in the sacraments and especially when we receive Holy Communion. We consume the Body and Blood of Christ and as an act od reverence we sometimes pray, "My Lord and my God". We grow in our faith when, as St.John reminds us in the Second Reading, we love those around us. The two commandments are interrelated: when we love God, we love God's children. When we love God's children, we show our love for God. The appearance of the Risen Jesus to Thomas teaches us that when we touch the wounds of the Body of Christ then our faith is deepened. We touch the wounds of Jesus when we reach out to those who suffer, the sick child, the dying parent, those who are poor or abused, those who have to go hungry. There we faithfully live the commandment to love God and to love others.

A prayer from Holy Island:-

May the Christ who walks wih wounded feet walk with us on the road.

May the Christ who serves with wounded hands stretch out our hands to serve.

May the Christ who loves with wounded heart open our hearts to love
