#### GOSPEL REFLECTION.

Today we hear the wonderful story of the Prodigal Son. There are so many different aspects to the story that can help us in our faith and in our lives each day. It is about forgiveness, acceptance, love, everything! Jesus wanted to emphasise the great love that God has for each of us by repeating the point in three separate stories. First, he shared the story of the shepherd looking for the lost sheep; then, about a woman searching frantically for a lost coin; then finally, about a father who embraces his lost son. Each story ends, not in reprimand, but in rejoicing.

It would be interesting how the story of the Prodigal Son unfolds after the Gospel story ends. For example, are the brothers reconciled to each other? Did the Prodigal Son go off again with more of his father's money? Or did he settle down once again, lesson learned, to work on his father's farm? Jesus includes the resentful older brother in the story because he wants us to act in a very different way than him. It can be a struggle, but forgiveness and acceptance can change people's lives. So, which of the people in the story do we identify with the most? There is probably a little bit of them in each one of us. Are we like the elder son, jealous of those who seem to be getting along in life better than us? Are we like the prodigal Son, able to recognise our mistakes and come back home? Hopefully there is something of the father in us who loved his son so much that he didn't reprimand him but rejoiced and gave thanks when he came home.
