GOSPEL REFLECTION.

During this year we have heard St. Luke's Gospel proclaimed each Sunday. St. Luke presents some of the most graphic parables about people in need, which develop the theme of the Beatitudes, beginning, "How happy are you who are poor, yours is the Kingdom of God." He tells us that it is those who are poor, those who are hungry, those who weep and those who are persecuted who will be blessed. St. Luke invites us to open our hearts and reach out to those in need, exemplified nowhere more graphically than in the story of the rich man and Lazarus, which we listened to at Mass a few weeks ago.

In this context, in his message for the World Day of the Poor2021, Pope Francis recalled the words of St. John Chrysostom: "The merciful are like a harbour for those in need: the harbour welcomes and frees from danger all those who are shipwrecked; whether they are evil, good people or whatever they may be, the harbour brings them shelter. You too, therefore, when you see on land a man or a woman who has suffered the shipwreck of poverty, do not judge, do not ask for an account of the conduct, but deliver them from their misfortune." The invitation on the World Day of the Poor is to look around us, encounter others, see those in need and come to their assistance. As we strive to live out the Gospel message let us pray that we may always see the face of Christ in those in need.
