GOSPEL REFLECTION.

St. Luke's Gospel constantly mentions Jesus being at prayer. It has even been called the Gospel of Prayer. Jesus is found at prayer, particularly when he is faced with a big decision or an important event. The greatest example is, perhaps, the garden of Gethsemane. Jesus went out, in accordance with his usual custom, to the Mount of Olives, and he encourages his disciples to pray and not enter into temptation.

Jesus usually prays by himself, but he encourages his disciples to follow his example. At one point in the Gospel, they ask him to teach them to pray and Jesus, in Matthew's Gospel teaches them to prayer we now know as the Lord's Prayer. It's a shorter version of the one we use but contains the same coupling of praise and petition. Jesus uses the story of a widow demanding justice. She finally receives it, but only after campaigning for it for a long time. Jesus is suggesting that prayer can be a petition too but, rather than petitioning an unjust judge-which the widow had to do, we are petitioning God, our loving Father. So let us trust in him for all our needs and never lose heart.
