READINGS FOR THE WEEKEND.

First Reading- Amos 6:1, 4-7

The prophet denounces the complacency of wealthy people who live a life of luxury and pleasure while ignoring the dangers into which the society around them is falling.

Second Reading St Paul to Timothy 6:11-16

St. Paul encourages the young leader of the community to take Jesus as his example and so live up to the demands and responsibilities of his position.

Gospel Reading – Luke 16:19-31

Jesus tells the story of the fate of the rich man and the beggar Lazarus, warning his listeners of the danger of neglecting those who are in need of help and assistance.

GOSPEL REFLECTION.

Jesus' parable of the rich man and Lazarus warns us that we should always share what we have with the poor and needy. It is a warning to us to open our hearts to those around us. We do not know Lazarus is in such dire circumstances, and the fact that we are not told suggests that it doesn't matter. The point is that next door to each other, in almost every country throughout the world, the extreme rich and the extreme poor live next door to each other. Many of us see this regularly in towns and cities in our own country too. There is a tendency to think that helping the poor is a matter of charity, but for the prophets it is a question of justice.

As Christians we must take the Word of God as presented in the scriptures very seriously. We have to allow it to challenge the way we live and especially the way we help others. Listen to the warning God gives to the rich man about his relatives: "If they will not listen to Moses or the prophets-that is, the Word of God- then nothing will convince them". Jesus stands in the line of Moses and the prophets and it is his teaching in the Gospel that we must think about. Let us pray that the Word of God may be alive and active in our lives and hearts, especially in the way we help those around us.
