#### GOSPEL REFLECTION.

In today's Gospel Jesus noticed people who pushed themselves to the top of the social ladder because they had a full wallet, or a big house or an important job that put them above others in the workplace. Self-proclaimed celebrities invited Jesus for a meal in the hope that his presence would boost their public image. They liked to hear him speak but they also watched his every mouthful of food and drink, commenting on it afterwards. Jesus was aware of the shallow pretence of people whose real interest was in self-promotion and their own bank balance. He came as someone to heal the sick and so he accepted the invitations and polite conversations of social climbers, hoping that his presence might make a difference.

Jesus tried to reach out to everyone, especially those who he thought had lost their way. What mattered for Jesus was that which was in a person's heart. Jesus knew that "anyone who exalts themselves shall be humbled". He knew the dangers that these people were inflicting upon themselves by thinking they were greater than others, just because of social status or wealth. May we become the people that God calls us to be. May we see the face of Christ in the poorest and humblest people in the world and share our faith and love with them.
