GOSPEL REFLECTION.

One of the most persistent calls of Jesus is the call to live a simple life. Today's Gospel ends with the words of Jesus: "None of you can be my disciple unless you give up all your possessions." The call to give up our possessions and give money to the poor is a constant theme throughout the teaching of Jesus. The first Christians in Jerusalem did this, and throughout history many others have done it and still do. The Gospels challenge always to see the face of Christ in the poor and needy we may encounter each day. Jesus himself always went the "extra mile" with people throughout the Gospel passages. Perhaps think of the Woman at the Well, the story of Zacchaeus, the ten lepers, and the many different accounts of Jesus reaching out to people. We don't just have to give financially. Sometimes our time and presence are what people need most. As we listen to today's Gospel story may it inspire us to reach out to the poor and needy in whatever way we can.
