GOSPEL REFLECTION.

This weekend we listen to the wonderful message of the Beatitudes from the Gospel of Matthew. The Beatitudes remind us to look after those around us and the world, rather than focussing on ourselves all the time. Jesus' vision of the Kingdom of God was of a community where hunger and poverty are no more. He recognised the struggles of people in this world in so many ways. But he saw a blessedness in hoping for a better world and a contentment in living simply, or even going without, in order that others might have enough. Sharing a meal, giving to charity, working as a volunteer: there are many ways in which people willingly deprive themselves for the sake of others and, in doing so, help to bring about the Kingdom of God.

Hopefully we have all encountered the joyously unselfish, unassuming kind of people Jesus describes in the Beatitudes. We see them all around us, quietly getting on in the background, their minds on helping others, their focus away from themselves. They may get taken for granted sometimes, but they deserve respect. They are an inspiration – and their time will come, for they are the kind of people who work heroically to reduce our carbon footprint. Those who tread most gently upon this planet will be the ones to save it. Jesus made a promise, "they shall have the earth for their heritage". Today's Gospel makes it clear that God's Kingdom is for those with an eye for the common good rather than looking after their own self-interests.
